PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO 3rd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 13 NOVEMBER 2017

This year has been full of excitement! Most notable among the highlights has been the inclusion of Asquith Women's Bowling Club into the District. Asquith's application to join us was given impetus by the enforced closure of their previous District Association. Having to find a new District to call home, Asquith ladies chose to apply to us and I commend the generosity of spirit shown by North Shore clubs in embracing change and unanimously voting to accept Asquith as a member. It's great to see members of our newest, and incidentally largest, club already putting themselves forward to serve on District committees. I trust that when we begin our bowling season in the New Year, everyone will be making the Asquith ladies feel very welcome on the greens.

This year on the greens, our bowlers performed admirably, despite battling almost-constant rain during the Pennant season followed by persistent and sometimes gale-force wind ever since. Despite often-adverse conditions, players won through the Regional Play-Offs to progress to the State Finals for the Grade 3 Pennant and the State Singles, Triples, Senior Pairs and Senior Fours. As well as playing some great bowls, these successful North Shore players gave me an excuse to watch the State Play-Offs at both Bateau Bay and Taren Point, and barrack for the Lindfield-Killara, Mosman, Neutral Bay and North Sydney competitors. It was terrific to see them do so well; especially Jenny Hepburn's team who got through to the semi-final of the State Triples. Well done girls!!

In the inter-District and inter-Region games, North Shore had the usual mixed success. Playing *alongside* bowlers from our Region 15 sister-district Manly-Warringah, we once again triumphed over Region 16 to retain the Anita Linden Trophy; however, playing *against* Manly-Warringah in an attempt to win the Jean McKinnon Shield, we still haven't notched up a win this year, the task was made even harder when rain turned the greens to lakes!

Following on from the inaugural Senior Pairs championship in 2016, this year's Senior Pairs proved the most successful of our District events, seeing a significant boost in entries. Whilst support for many of the other championships remained fairly stable, numbers in the Open Pairs and Singles showed significant decline. Both those events have been scheduled for weekend play in 2018, in an effort to open up participation in championships to more of our working-bowlers, who are so important to the future of our sport.

This year, players took the opportunity to enjoy the sport on other clubs' greens by entering the many carnivals on offer throughout North Shore and neighbouring Districts. This included participation in the Harbourside Triples that was run on Saturdays during the Pennant season by Julie Hayden. Fourteen teams from ten clubs in Region 15 completed in this year's event, with the winners this year being from Pittwater Memorial. Julie has done a great job establishing this weekend triples event as part of the Statewide "weekend league", and it will continue from 2018 run by Judy Le Gras of Warringah WBC.

Over the past few years, our District Chairman of Match Marianne has done a great job liaising with Manly-Warringah to ensure that club carnival dates do not clash. Recently, we also achieved agreement on common dates for our District meetings in 2018, so those involved in District administration will have equal opportunity to support club carnivals throughout the Region.

Many have enjoyed other opportunities for catching up with bowling friends from other clubs. True to form, Veteran's Day this year was a lovely day of friendship, although further changes to the "Veteran's badge" system from WBNSW meant I had only three badges to present (two of them to players close to 90). The age-related badge system has now been discontinued; however, I don't expect that to dampen the spirit of our active bowlers at such days in years to come.

Now another year draws to a close, and so does my term as President. Looking back on the last three years, I'm impressed with the way people have embraced the District and adapted to change in a general spirit of goodwill. However, good attitude alone can not carry the District into the future. Our membership today appears to be down only 5% on what it was when we started; however, this figure is skewed by our having acquired four clubs that were previously in other Districts. Without the injection of bowlers from Chatswood, Artarmon, Lane Cove and Asquith, the statistics would show a decrease in membership of 21% since the District merger three years ago. Now that our Region 15's boundaries are in line with the men's "Zone 9", I don't believe we can expect any more *clubs* to enter our District; so the challenge will be to get more *bowlers* to enter our clubs. The District in a fortunate position financially, should clubs in future wish to investigate ways in which we could support recruitment efforts.

I and the District are greatly indebted to all the committee members who have helped us through our first three years. In particular, I extend special thanks to Marianne Coningsby for the great job she and her Match Committee have done organising our bowling program. Marianne, Diane McBryde, Anne Cowlshaw and Trish Wilson are now leaving us – in Marianne's case, after giving an immense amount of her time to us and the former Mid North Shore for a total of 12 years, the last 10 as committee Chairman. Thank you to Patricia Pierson and her Selection Committee for all the times they're watching on the sidelines, in preparation for making the hard choices involved in choosing our District representatives. Joy Beattie is leaving Selection this year, and I thank on behalf of the District for the calm manner in which she approached the job. I also wish to thank Jeanette Staniland and her Social Committee for helping to arrange such festive occasions for the District throughout the year. Jeanette as well as committee members Pamela Caganoff and Maureen Medin are all leaving us this year, but of course we still look forward to seeing them on the greens.

The other end-of-year farewell is to two of our member clubs. Roseville had its last day on the greens on 21 October and its bowlers are now playing on the greens at Lindfield ahead of the merger, anticipated early in the New Year, which will create the Lindfield Rollers in their new white-and-blue uniform. Gordon will close at the end of this year, but we look forward to still seeing the ladies' familiar faces next year -- just in a variety of different uniforms.!

Finally, it has been a great honour to have been involved with our District since its inception; to have had the privilege of working with such a dedicated team; and to have held the self-appointed role of "North Shore bowlers' #1 Supporter". Thanks for having me, and happy bowling!

INCOME

Capitation fees were up on last year's results and up on budget.

Interest once again was down due to falling interest rates.

There was a slight increase in new members.

Miscellaneous income was increased and some of the increase was due to the decision taken at the Management Committee Meeting on the 10th October, 2016 to subsidise the District Christmas Party and request all attending to pay \$10.00. This will also be the case this year.

EXPENDITURE

This year we have a surplus of income over expenditure of \$3,839.00. This is mainly due to only having one grade in the State Pennant Play-offs, down from three in the previous year.

⁴ This negligible decrease reflects Asquith joining North Shore; otherwise, the loss would be almost 10%.

⁵ The negligible change in the first year was because 3 clubs joined North Shore from neighbouring Districts; without these new members, the decrease would have been 6%.

⁶ The seemingly small change since establishment was achieved with the addition of 4 clubs into from North Shore from neighbouring Districts; without this input, the decrease in District membership over our first three years would be almost 21%.
